Government of Canada loan for \$4,000,000, 4 per cent. Currency Bonds.

The Minister of Finance for the Dominion of Canada is authorized to receive tenders for a loan of \$4,000,000 currency bonds, bearing interest from the 1st of November, 1883, at the rate of 4 per centum per annum, payable half-yearly on the 1st of May and 1st of November of each year, at his office in the Finance Department, Ottawa.

This loan issued under the authority of an Act of the Parliament of the Dominion of Canada, passed during their last Session, (46th Victoria, cap 2, sec 4).

The object of the loan is partly to provide for the payment of debts maturing or redeemable in the course of the current fiscal year, and partly for expenditure on public works.

The principal of the loan now offered is to be repaid at Ottawa in twenty years.
