CAP. I.

An Act imposing duties upon certain articles imported into this Province.

Passed 1st March 1887.

[7E, His Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the Assembly of New Brunswick, in General Assembly convened, for raising the necessary sup-' plies to defray the expenses of His Majesty's Government within this Province, have freely and voluntarily resolved to give and grant to the King's Most • Excellent Majesty the several rates and duties hereinafter mentioned, and do

'therefore pray Your Excellency that it may be enacted;'

I. And be it enacted by His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, by and Duties on imwith the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly, and by the ported articles authority of the same, that on and after the first day of April which will be in this Majesty for the present year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven, there use of the Probe and are hereby granted to the King's Most Excellent Majesty, his heirs and port of the Gosuccessors, for the use of this Province and for the support of the Government vernment. thereof, the several rates and duties hereinafter mentioned, on the following articles, which may be imported or brought into this Province either by sea, by inland navigation or by land, from any part of the British Empire or from any foreign port or place, or which may be saved from any wreck or stranded ship or vessel, viz:

For and upon all rum, spirits, gin, hollands, geneva, whiskey and cordials, one Rum &c. shilling and sixpence per gallon;

For and upon brandy, two shillings per gallon;

Brandy.

For and upon all wines, the sum of ninepence per gallon; and further, twenty Wines. five per cent. upon the true and real value thereof at the place from whence they were imported: Provided always, that in no case shall a higher rate of duty be imposed on any wine than three shillings per gallon;

For and upon all molasses, one penny per gallon;

For and upon all shrub, santa or lime juice, sixpence per gallon; For and upon every hundred weight of dried fruits, five shillings;

For and upon all coffee, loaf or refined sugar, one penny per pound;

For and upon all brown or Muscovado sugar, on the quantity mentioned in the original

Molasses. Shrub &c. Dried Fruits. Coffee, Sugars.
