Teven pounds, fifteen shillings and nine pence current money of this Province, being for wages due to their Messenger and Door keeper during the present session of the Legislature; and that the same he charged

to the Fund by Law appropriated to that purpose.

Refolved, That an humble Address be presented to his Excellency the Governor, to request his Excellency will be pleased to issue his warrant to Samuel Philhps, Esquire, Clerk of this House, for the sum of thirty pounds currency, as an additional allowance to him for translating, or causing the same to be done, and for under Clerks and Assistants, from the 24th of June last to the 24th of June next, agreeable to the resolve of this House of the second of May 1795; and that the said sum be charged to the Fund by Law appropriated to that purpose.

Resolved, that an humble Address be presented to his Excellency the Governor, praying that his Excellency will be pleased to order to be advanced to Mr. Speaker, the sum of one hundred pounds sterling, towards further defraying the expence of purchasing standard weights and measures for the use of this Province; and that his Excellency will also be pleased to order the balance that may be due thereon, when the same shall be ascertained, to be paid to the Agent or Attorney of Adam Lym-

burner, Fsquire; and that this House will make good the same.

Ordered, that Messieurs Grant, De Bonne, Richardson, Lester, Duniere

and De Salaberry do present the foregoing addresses to his Excellency the Governor.

On motion of Mr. De Salaberry, feconded by Mr. Berthelot,

The House adjourned till to morrow afternoon, two of the clock.

## Friday, 61h May, 1-96.

His Excellency the Governor, with the Addresses of this House, had accordingly presented the same to his Excellency; who had been pleased to inform them, that he would give orders to comply therewith.

Mr. Young from the Committee to whom was referred the Petitions from the Magistrates of Quebec; Sundry Inhabitants of the Town and Banlieu of Montreal; Sundry Inhabitants of the County of Leinster and Village of L'Assomption; the Electors of the Borough of William Henry, and of certain Butchers of the City of Quebec: Reported that the Committee had examined the matter thereof, and had directed him to report their opinions thereon to the House; and he read the report in his place, and afterwards delivered the same in at the table, where it was again read once throughout by the Clerk.

Which report is as followeth:
