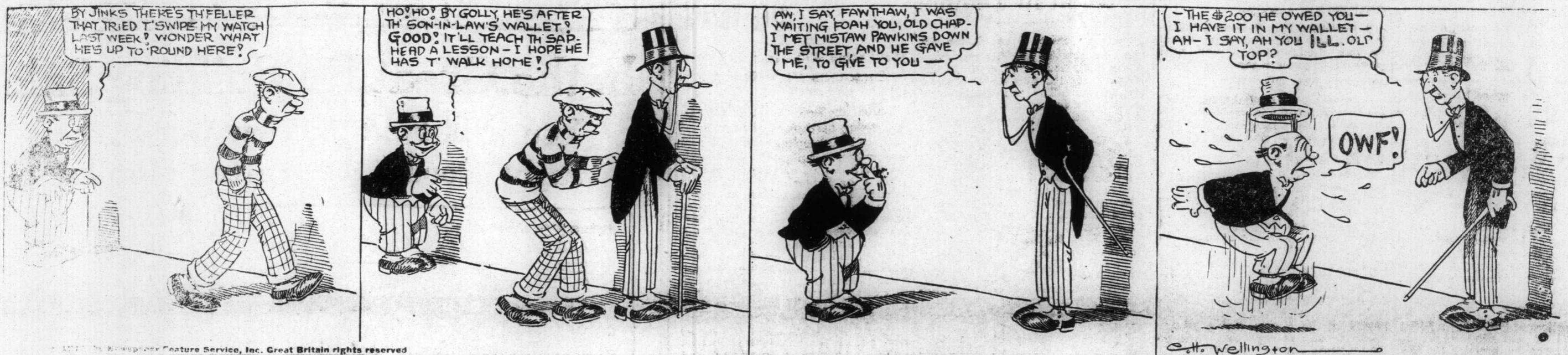

Chicago, June 9.—Christy Mathewson will be out of baseball for several weeks it was said today after the pitching star of the New York Nationals had undergone a rigid examination by a nerve specialist. Suffering from a nervous disorder of the left shoulder, Mathewson has been unable to take his regular turn in pitching for some time, and when the club reached Chicago he was obliged to place himself under the care of a specialist. He had been able to sleep more than the hours at night, he said, because of the pain. The disorder extended to the right shoulder yesterday.
