TWO MILITARY WITNESSES AT THE INQUIRY

Knew Nothing of the Business End of Shell Buying, They Said.

HUGHES ANXIOUS TO MAKE TIME

All Profits of Shell Committee Were to Revert to War Office.

Ottawa, May 16.—This was military day at the Health-Duff Commission to enquire into the Kytz charges. Only two witnesses were heard, Major-General Benson, who was Master-General of Ordnance during the events that led to Mr. Kytz's speech in Parliament, and Col. F. D. Lafferty, superintendent of the Quebec Arsenal. Both of these were examined by Mr. Hellmuth and cross-examined by Mr. Carvell, but they stated that they had little knowledge of business affairs in connection with the Shell Committee. They were military members and left business arrangements to the manufacturing members.

Both General Benson and Colonel Lafferty were emphatic that in all the arrangements made Sir Sam Hughes was anxious to get delivery of the shells and fuse as soon as possible, and, as far as was consistent with this, to have all supplies made in Canada. Both were also emphatic that it was always understood that any profits between War Office allowances and the actual cost under contracts made by the Shell Committee should be returned to the War Office.

Both witnesses declared that so far as their knowledge went Col. Allison had no connection with any of the transactions with which they were concerned. It is expected that tomorrow other members of the Shell Committee, including Col. Greville Harston and Mr. Edward Carnegie, will be called, and a good deal of detailed testimony taken pending the return of Mr. B. P. Youlam, who is to resume his evidence on Wednesday.

At the hearing yesterday Mr. E. R. B. Johnston was absent, but he is expected back today. In his absence Mr. F. B. Carvell acted as chief Liberal counsel.

SIR ROGER CASMENT DANIEL J. BAILEY TO TRIAL

Decision Reached
Conclusion of Preliminary Trial and Court

By Special Wire to the Courier.
London, May 17.—Roger Casement and Daniel J. Bailey were committed for trial today for high treason. This decision was reached the conclusion of the preliminary hearing of these men on the charge of participation in the Irish rebellion, which has been in progress since Monday. The date of the trial and the court before which it will be held have not yet been announced.

London, May 17.—The decision to whether Sir Roger Casement and Daniel J. Bailey must stand trial for their lives in the High Court of Justice on a charge of high treason is expected to be handed down late today by Sir John Dickinson, sitting as committing magistrate in the Bow Police Court.

The prosecution has very little more evidence to introduce against the head of the Sinn Fein revolt, the former British soldier, whom it is accused of having seduced from allegiance. It is generally believed the prisoners will reserve their defence for the higher courts, although their lawyers have consistently used to make any statement as to their intentions.
