

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, who was at the commencement of the present war, and has since continued to be a British subject or a subject of an allied or neutral country, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at Dominion Landa Agency or Sub-Agency for District. Entry by proxy may be made on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upos and cultivation of land in each of three years. In certain districts a homesteader may
