

Coal deposits occur in all the Australian colonies, the principal ones being situated in New South Wales The first deposits were discovered by Clark in 1797, and the first coal was mined in Australia in 1826. Reliable authorities estimate Australia's coal deposits at about 80,000,000,000 tons. In 1899 the output amounted to 4,597,000 tons, valued at \$6,512,-400. Up to the end of 1899 there had been mined in Australia 85,969,-136 tons of coal. No less than 2, 798,523 tons were exported last year, chiefly to the Island of Ceylon, by Lord Kitchener alone.
