SYNOPSIS OF COAL MINING REGULATIONS Coal mining right of the Dominic

in Manitobs, Saskatchewan and Alberta, the Yukon Territory, the North-west Territories and in a portion of the Province of British Columbia, may be leased for a term of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 an acre. Not more than 2 500 acres will be leased to one applicant. Application for a lease must be made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-agent in the district in which the rights applied for

are situated. In surveyed territory the land must be described by sections, or legal sub-divisions of sections, and in unsurveyed territory the tract applied for shall be staked out by the applicent himself.

Each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$5 which will be refunded if the rights applied for are not available, but not otherwise. A royalty shall be paid on the merchantable output of the mine at the rate of five cents per ton.

The person operating the mine shall furnish the Agent with sworn returns 60,000 volts of electricity. One of accounting for the full quantity of the men is believed to be Charles merchantable coal mined and pay the Worley, who came here six months royalty thereon. If the coal mining rights are not being operated, such returns should be furnished at least
