#### **NO IRREGULARITIES IN ACCOUNTS** YEARS OF STOMACH

Messrs. Peat and Prender, of London, England, representing the trustees of the defunct Charing Cress Bank, and the bond holders and sharenolders of the Atlantic, Quetec & Western Railway, the Gaspe line now under construction, in which the bank's funds were heavily invested, waited on Sir Wilfrid Laurier, Hon. G. P. Graham and Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux with a view to securing the government's co-operation in assisting the railway company to carry out its understanding.

The representative of the British investors in the railway and in the bank, whose collapse a year or so ago created a sensation in English finan-cial circles, declared that so far as the railway was concerned there was no truth in the rumors that several hundred thousand dollars of the funds nvested therein could not be properly accounted for. A careful investigati.n had shown no irregularities.

This statement sets at rest the rumors started some months agoin the opposition press to the effect that Hon. Mr. Lemieux, as member for Gaspe, might be found to be implicated in the alleged frauds.

It is hoped that a satisfactory financial arrangements can be made to carry on the companie's undertakings to complete and operate the road, and also to lease the 15C miles of the Baie des Chaleurs line connecting Matapedia in New Brunswick with Peniusula.




