It is clear from this that the rees in the British Empire will soon be brought up to about Five Million Two years ago it would have been thought impossible to have such a force under arms. IRISH PARTY WILL RESIST COM-PULSION.

LONDON, To-day. The Irish party held a meeting i the Commons yesterday, John Redmond presiding, and affirmed its unshaken adherence to the resolution adopted on June 17th, opposing com pulsory military service, adding: "All that has occured since, more than justifies the attitude then taken by the Irish party, and the magnificent response of the British people to Lord Derby's recruiting campaign has proved that patriotism of the country can be relied upon to supply by voluntary effort all the men necessary to carry the war to a victorious conclu sion. We repeat our resolve to re sist by every means in our power any attempt to bring into force a system of compulsory military service."


