

MEDICAL SUPERVISION NEEDED TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF CONSUMPTION IN SCHOOLS

Medical supervision of the schools is badly needed, and steps should be taken to provide such, according to Dr. W. E. Fairfield, house surgeon at St. Mary's Hospital, Green Bay, Wis. Tuberculosis, the disease which takes the lives of hundreds where others claim one.

Teachers could do much to aid in eliminating consumptive children from the ranks of the healthy. The first manifestation of tuberculosis is an afternoon rise of temperature. Teachers could be taught to take the temperature of the children and report suspicious cases.

DUKE OF PORTLAND FACES HOT BATTLE

Druce Claim to Title Soon To Be Fought in Courts.

HAS TWO GOOD WITNESSES

One, the Countess of Cork, Knew Nobleman in Both of His Alleged Dual Characters.

London, Feb. 4.—The Druce claim to the Duke of Portland's title and estates surely will be the most sensational and romantic case in the English courts for half a century.

The suit is being pressed in the form of an action against Lord Howard de Walden to eject him from the vast London real estate which his father inherited from the fifth Duke of Portland.

Druce has two good witnesses to testify from direct personal knowledge, that the fifth Duke of Portland was the same man as Druce of the Baker street bazar.

The duke bequeathed to the countess the famous Portland pearls. When the sixth duke came into the title he brought suit for the pearls, claiming they were family heirlooms and inalienable from the title.

Booth's Farewell Tour Aged Head of Salvation Army to Once More Circle the Globe.

London, Feb. 4.—Plans for the approaching tour of the aged and venerable Booth, the patriarchal head of the Salvation Army, have been completed.

300 CHARGES OF SWINDLING American in Paris Accused of Fraudulently Obtaining Commissions.

Paris, Feb. 4.—A case of alleged swindling was heard in a police court this afternoon in which there were over 300 complainants, 250 of whom had jointly summoned Donald Downie, an American, who conducts the Journal of Paris.

Washington, Feb. 4.—Brigadier-General Samuel Beckley, retired, one of the oldest and best-known United States army officers, and formerly quartermaster-general, died here yesterday in his 80th year.

SNOWSLIDE HIT DEVLIN MINE

Demolished Buildings Instantly and Killed Two Men.

SLIDE CAME DOWN 300 FEET

One Man Is Missing—Roar of Huge Snowball Heard For Miles.

Nelson, B. C., Feb. 4.—The first snowslide of the season resulted in the death of Harry Wadsworth, brother of William Ward, of the Nelson House, and the remarkable escape of two miners—Soper and Kennedy.

The slide occurred about 8 a.m., at the Devlin group on Sheep Creek, 11 miles out of Salmo. The slide, caused by the prevailing soft weather, following the recent heavy snowfall, came down 300 feet, along a new track, and right through a well-timbered stretch.

Without warning, the avalanche, which started 300 feet higher up the hill, and which gathered size and strength as the huge snowball tore down the mountain side, crashed over the camp site, completely demolishing the cookhouse and burying the bunkhouse under many feet of snow.

The deceased was about 40 years of age, and leaves a widow and family in England. He came to British Columbia from the old country some three years ago, and had been working on the G. P. in connection with the property.
