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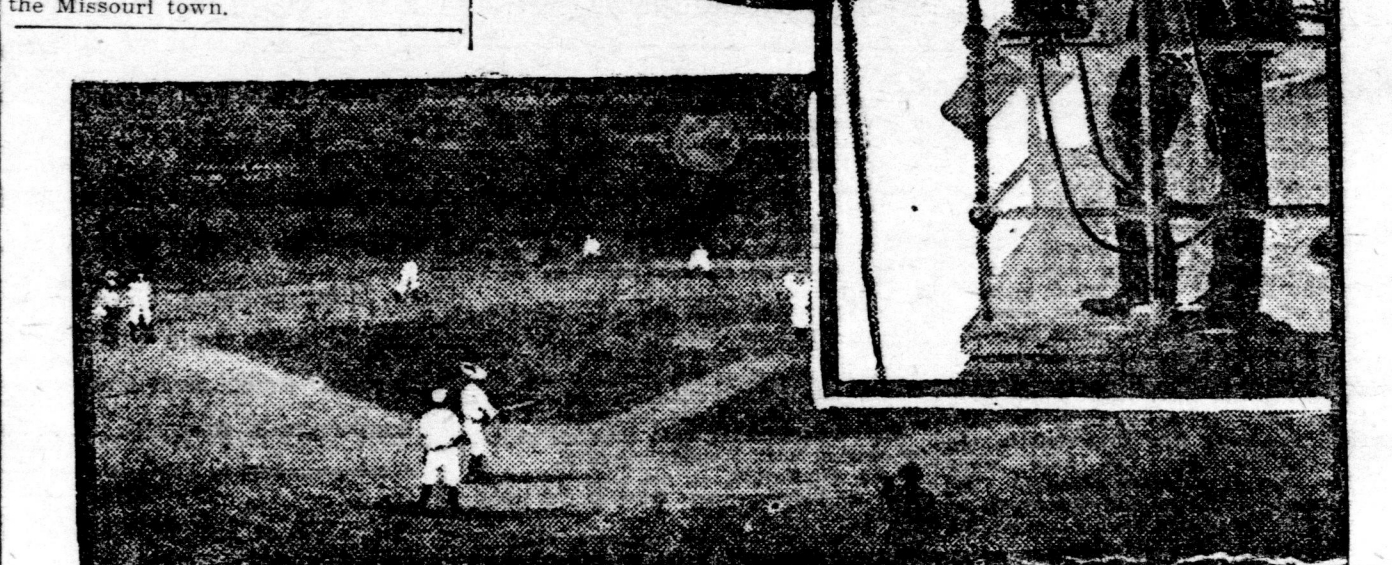
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FIRST PICTURES OF NIGHT BASEBALL AT CINCINNATI

President Hedges Says Manager Will Be With Him All Year and Indefinitely.

Detroit, June 22.—Robert Lee Hedges, president and principal owner of the St. Louis American League Club, took occasion last evening to deny some reports that are being sent out daily from St. Louis, and to impart a bit of interesting information. The reports are to the effect that James R. McAlleer, manager of the Browns, has resigned, or is about to do so. The information was to the effect that Mr. McAlleer is not under contract to the St. Louis club now, and never has been, in the seven years that he has handled the team from the Missouri town.
