Ontario Government Petitioned by the Fish and Game Protective Association.

Toronto, March 28 .- "In order to preent our waters and forests from being depleted, and thus deprive the province of the wealth which tourists oring into the country, we ask that a petition be presented to the Lieutenant-Governor-in-council to place the administration of the laws in connection with the fish and game resources of Ontario, in the hands of a commis sion, as the influence of party politics aims at thwarting an effectual conservation of this valuable natural asset." The above drastic resolution was passed at a meeting of the Ontario Forest, Fish and Game Protective Association at their annual meetng in Toronto University today. Delegates were present from branches at London, Perth, Belleville, Bobcaygeon, Hamilton, Soo and Windsor.

The feeling of the delegates towards the subject was well expressed by Mr. Thomas Ritchie, of Belleville, who said that he thought the fisheries and game preserves of Ontario were worth more to the country than all the gold and silver mines put together.

Later on, the association, at the uggestion of the Windsor branch, further agreed to ask the Government to devote a sum at least equal to the amount of the revenue derived from the fish and game rights to administer the game laws, and develop the value of the fish and game preserves.

The policy of the Quebec Government in permitting wealthy sporting clubs to acquire shooting and fishing rights over large tracts at a nominal cost was condemned by implication by the secretary. Mr. Kelly Evans, who moved a resolution, seconded by Judge Fralick, of Belleville, urging the Ontario Government to retain all hunting and fishing lands and waters as the property of the public and refuse to lease them to private parties.
