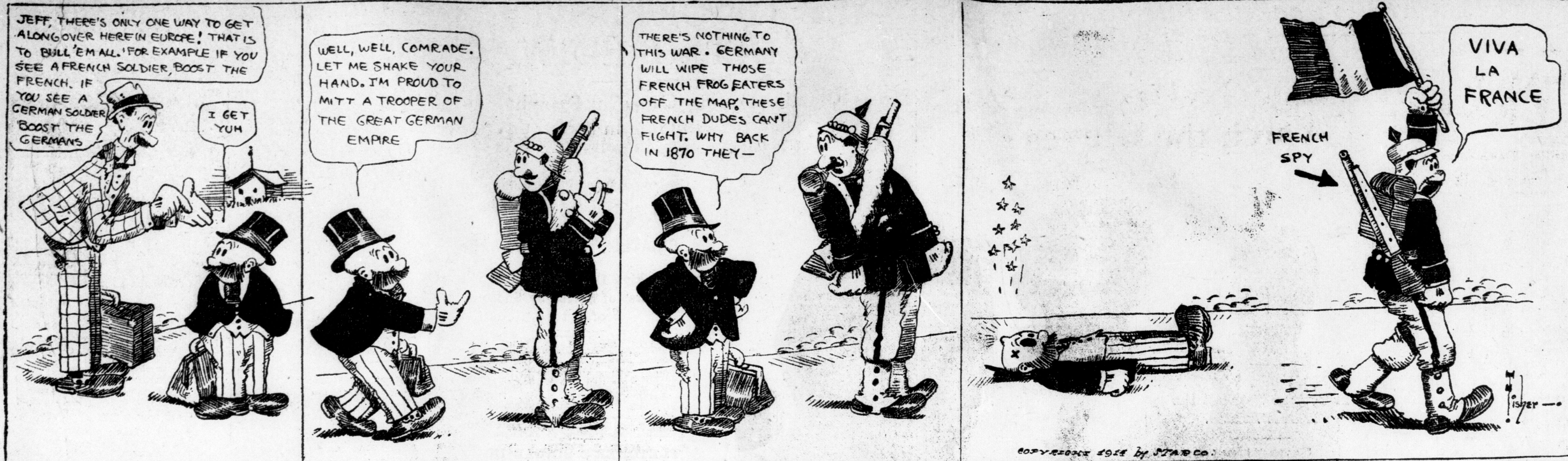

Paced Second Heat in Free-for-All in 1:59.1-4.

PETER PEARL'S 2:17 TROT

Murphy Again Cleans Up, Winning Two of the Three Events Yesterday.

DETROIT, Mich., Sept. 18.—Frank Bogash Jun., the 1913 Chamber of Commerce stake winner, who set the State Fair race record at 2:02½ on Monday, paced the most sensational mile ever recorded in a race this afternoon, when he won the free-for-all pacing stake. Walter Cochato set the pace to the half in 1:04, but the upper turn McMahon drove wide and lost. The mile, with the exception of a hippodrome heat at Indianapolis, won by Minor Heir in 1:53, is the fastest least ever paced in a race.

Peter Pearl, a winner at the June meeting on the half-mile track here, won the 2:17 trot after five heats, and Tom Murphy landed the 2:17 pace with the 2-year-old colt, Marion Marquee.
