DESIGNER FIFE DECLARES CHALLENGER IS ON WAY

America's Cup Next Year For a Certainty

New York, July 22.—Wm. Fife, the designer of Sir Thomas Lipton's cup yachts Shamrock II and Shamrock III, declared Saturday on his arrival from Europe that a British challenger for the America's cup would likely be found in American waters next year to try to lift the historic international yachting trophy. No intimation was given by Mr. Fife as to whether the challenger would come from Sir Thomas Lipton or some other yachtsman in England, but when asked if the report from Scotland that he had accepted a commission to design a Shamrock IV. was true he smillingly replied that he would have to decline to make an answer under the circum-
