The Stock Horses Leased.

A large crowd gathered at the barn f the St. John Agricultural Society last Wednesday morning, when the Percheron and Clydesdale horses lately purchased by the Board of Agriculure were to be leased for the season. everal agricultural societies throughout the province were represented. Dr. Taylor and Messrs. H. J. Fowler and Chas. I. Smith appearing for King's County Central Society; Mesers. D. M. Fairweather, Thomas Roach and George A. Barnes for Susex and Studholm Society; Mr. F. W. Brown for Grand Falls and other soc eies; Mr. Geo. L. Colwell, Mr. Fox and Mr S. L. Peters for societies in Queens county. Mr. W. A. Lockhart cted as auctioneer. Before proceeding with the leasing he read the conitions, some of which summarized are that the lesse of each horse should give a bond for its safe return, the ond being \$1,500 in the case of the Percheron and \$2,000 in the case of the Cidesdale, that the horses should not be taken from the Province, nor leased first and was bid by Mr. Fairweather for the Sussey and Studholm Society for \$300. This society re ceives a bonus of \$25 from the St. John Agricultural Society on certain conditions. The district for which it was purchased is No. 2, comprising St. John and Kings counties. Mr. George L Colwell bid in the Clydesdale horse for \$225, for the Cambridge agricultural society in Queens county Mr. Lugrin announced that next year the Board of Agriculture hoped to have a number of horses, ten or twelve for leasing.
