Mrs. Edgar has so arranged the story and the methods of telling it, that the difficulty is to lay the book down. In the chapters which precede the outbreak of the war are found pictures of the times, painted with all the ease and fidelity which familiar correspondence permits, and are little less interesting than the narrative of more exciting national occurrences. The letters of Mr. T. G. Ridout are literary accomplishments in themselves, and Mrs. Edgar's compilation of these and other documents, with her own contributions, have resulted in a most valuable addition to the library of Canada. The book will be read a first time for its romance, and be constantly referred to for its accurate and valuable information."—*Montreal Herald.*
