Miss Miller has no desire to enter the operatic field, preferring concert and oratorio singing to any other. 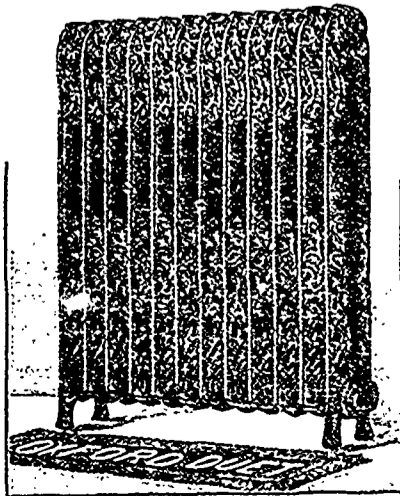
