AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE UNION OF SOVIET SOCIALIST REPUBLICS ON COOPERATION IN THE INDUSTRIAL APPLICATION OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

The Government of Canada and the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics,

DESIROUS of developing further their friendly relations, their economic relations and their cooperation in the industrial application of science and technology,

Have agreed as follows:

ARTICLE I

The Government of Canada and the Government of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics undertake to encourage and develop economic and technical cooperation in the industrial application of science and technology between the two states, on the basis of mutual benefit and reciprocity.

ARTICLE II

The contracting Governments, by mutual agreement, will determine areas for this cooperation which they wish to promote, implement and encourage in the following ways:

- (a) exchanges of visits by experts and technicians, both individuals and delegations, including visits to industrial, research and development enterprises and institutions and trips to related field activities, for studies, training, lectures, consultations and exchanges of views and experience regarding industrial applications of science and technology;
- (b) organization of bilateral symposia and conferences on problems of the industrial application of science and technology, exchanges of information and documentation in this field, and thematic exhibitions of new types of industrial products;
- (c) conclusion of commercial agreements (including licensing) between the appropriate organizations in the two states, on the basis of the direct exchange of technological experience between industrial enterprises;
- (d) arrangements between competent Canadian and Soviet organizations and industrial enterprises for elaborating and perfecting industrial processes and technological projects, putting industrial installations into operation, and developing new types of products and equipment;
- (e) joint consultation and cooperation on specific problems of the industrial application of science and technology;
- (f) such other forms of cooperation as may be mutually agreed.

The costs of such visits and exchanges shall be borne by the sending side unless other arrangements are agreed between the organizations concerned; financial arrangements for other forms of cooperation will be separately determined as necessary.
