Mr. MEIGHEN: Shall we take up all the bills of the Minister of Finance?

Mr. ROBB: I should like to take them up.

Mr. SPENCER: I understand that tomorrow afternoon was set aside for the debate on the question of extending the work of the Banking committee. Is that right?

Mr. ROBB: I had a conversation with the chairman of the Banking and Commerce committee and I understood he had spoken to hon. gentlemen opposite. I may say that a number

of hon. gentlemen are leaving for Quebec city and they are anxious to be present when the debate takes place; some of them desire to speak on the subject. I understand too that there are some gentlemen who are absent. If it is agreeable to hon. members we will defer the debate for a few days until those who are away have returned.

Mr. SPENCER: May I point out that it has been already deferred three times.

'Motion agreed to and the House adjourned at 11.18 p.m.
