A Message was received from the Senate informing this House that the Senate had passed the following Bill, without amendment:

Bill No. C-34, An Act to amend the Veterans Insurance Act.

A Message was received from the Senate informing this House that the Senate had agreed to the amendments made by the House of Commons to Bill No. S-4, An Act respecting The Burrard Inlet Tunnel and Bridge Company, without amendment.

Mr. McCleave, from the Standing Committee on Miscellaneous Private Bills, presented the Fourteenth Report of the said Committee, which is as follows:

Pursuant to an Order of the House of Tuesday, August 12th, your Committee has reconsidered Bill No. SD-199, An Act for the relief of William Harrison Terry and heard evidence thereon.

Your Committee has agreed to report the said Bill without amendment.
