DEVELOPMENT AND PROFESSIONAL TRAINING.

Shortly before his death, the late Dean H.M. MacKay wrote an account of the development of the Faculty of Applied Science. The article appeared in the "McGill News" for June 1930, and dealt with many matters which would otherwise have claimed a place in a report on the work of the Faculty such as you ask for in your letter of November 26th, 1930. An earlier report, also from the pen of our late Dean, and published in the "McGill News", contains summaries of the replies of graduates of the Faculty to questionnaires designed to secure information regarding their activities, and to obtain their views on the question of the college training of engineers and on their own course in particular. The inquiry was sent to all graduates of the Faculty prior to and including the year 1924, whose addresses were known.

Similar inquiries were made at the same time by the leading engineering schools of the United States. It is believed that the large number of replies represents fairly the experience and opinion of our graduates. The survey was made under the
