"WHY I AM A METHODIST."

is nothing to indicate whether they more 'frequently' go together or more 'frequently' do not go together. Nor does it make a particle of difference ; for if 'they do not constantly go together,' then ' the theory is exploded, and all of Layman's three columns of Methodist parsonage, Cobden, quotations cannot put it together again.

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But as this letter is already longer than I intended, I will reserve further discussion of the subject for next issue.
