CLIMATE.—Victoria lies in about 125° Longitude West from Greenwich, and about 48-22 North
Latitude. The thermometer seldom gets as low as zero in winter. The winter of 1876 and 1877, was
the coldest for the past 18 years. The thermometer at the lowest 30 above zero, but very little
show, seldom weighing, much rain and wind. The coldest snap in winter lasts about one week. The
thermometer in summer ranges between 65° and 85°. The world cannot surpass the climate of Vic-
toria in the same Latitude.
First Drive.—Across James's Bay Bridge, round the mouth of the harbor, then following the
beach till you reach Cadboro Bay, then back to town by Fort street.
Second Drive.—Out to Swan Lake. Cross the road to the church at Cedar hill road, out to
Cadboro Bay and back to town.
Third Drive.—Round Beacon Hill through the lower land, pass the Richmond and back to town
by Cedar Hill.
Fourth Drive.—Equivalent to the Navy Yard, cross the Admiral's road to return; then follow the
Victoria arm to the Gorge bridge cross it and back to town.
Fifth Drive.—Out Douglas street pass Roland's farm; cross the road to Craigflower, and back to
town by the Craigflower road.
Sixth Drive.—Take the Burnside road, out to Parsons Bridge and back to town by the Metcalfean
road.
DELICIOUS PLEASANT GROUNDS.—Among the most prominent are Gold Stream, thirteen miles from
Victoria. Langford Lake, eleven miles from town. Langford Plains, fifteen miles from Victoria.
There is obtained a view of Victoria City, also, of the Public Park, etc. etc. Elk Lake, from which the
city obtains its water. Distance eight miles from Victoria, where pleasure boats are kept, and also,
splendid trout fishing. Saanich Arm, distance fifteen miles from town; a beautiful bay and fishing
harbor. The Gorge Hotel, Victoria Arm, splendid picnic ground surrounding, also, where the citizens
hold their yearly regatta, in honor of Her Majesty's Birthday, the 24th of May, situated about two
and a half miles from town.
