

- salt-bush* . . . the wild alkaline bush of the plains on which horses and sheep feed when the grass is gone.
- selector* . . . one who takes small portions of land for farming or settlement, and who may select land for this purpose on a squatter's station leased from the Government.
- Shearers' Joy* . . . a name given to colonial bear.
- shirallee* . . . a swag; or bundle of blankets, etc.
- shot me dead* . . . discharged me.
- station* . . . the squatter's homestead.
- stay-a-while* . . . a tangled bush, sometimes called wait-a-while.
- sundowner* . . . a tramp; given the name because he generally appeared at stations at nightfall.
- swag* . . . bundle of blankets, etc., to be carried on the back.
- swizzle* . . . a drink of liquor.
- to dummy* . . . to take advantage of the land-law by paying another to occupy land.
- to shout* . . . to treat or stand liquor.
- tucker* . . . food.
- wait-a-while* . . . see *stay-a-while*.
- wallaby* . . . a young kangaroo.
- wallaby track* . . . on the tramp.
- warrigal* . . . a wild dog, wild horse; anything aboriginal.
- wurley* . . . a black-fellow's house; humpy; gunyah.
