FOURTHLY---Because there is no ground to expeci, that the present concession will, in any way, facilitate the accomplishment of those objects which His Majesty's Representative hath recommended to the attention of the Provincial Legislature; but on the contrary, that it will probably lead to further encroachments upon the rights and privileges of this House; and ultimately, that it will prevent the adoption of those measures which are requisite at the present moment, for the support of His Majesty's Government.

FIFTHLY---Because we know of no precedent in the history of the Parent State, which can afford a shadow of justification to this House in the proceeding it has now adopted.

FINALLY---Because we are bound in duty to the King, in gratitude to the Imperial Parliament, and in justice to our fellow Subjects in this Province, firmly to resist every attempt to destroy the balance of our happy Constitution.
