A RECORD BREAKER

Guelph Fair Will Have to Have New Buildings to Accommodate Exhibits.

GUELPH, Sept. 22.—(Special.)—The Guelph Central Fair, with a list of prizes amounting to nearly \$5000, and with over 7000 exhibits, closed to-night. Never in the 38 years' existence of the Guelph and Centre Wellington Agricultural Society has the fair been such a decided success. In all the departments the exhibits were so crowded that the management will not attempt to hold the fair another year unless the city assists them in the erection of a complete new set of buildings and stables about twice the size of the present ones.

Rich Gold Discovery.

NELSON, B.C., Sept. 22.—Creston is wildly excited by the reported discovery of placer gold in Goat River by Ira Bean, an old-time prospector. A rush then occurred in the vicinity of the find, up to the present eighteen claims having been staked. A meeting of claim holders will be held this week for the purpose of forming a syndicate to carry out necessary tunnelling and to enable the gold to be taken from the bed of the stream to bed rock.

Wireless Was Interrupted.

BUFFALO, Sept. 22.—When the big passenger steamer Western States arrived in port at midnight, 15 hours behind her schedule, Capt. F. G. Stewart was mad clean through because over 50 wireless messages which he sent after the boat became disabled off Long Point, in Lake Erie, yesterday morning, had been interrupted.
