

JAMES SIMPSON ROASTS EATON'S

Labor Man Also Is Down On Police Force For Alleged Interference in Strike.

Striking clockmakers of the T. Eaton Co. to the number of 1000 assembled in the Labor Temple yesterday afternoon and listened to James Simpson, the labor orator, hold forth on the condition of labor in general and their strike in particular.

The firm came in for some scathing remarks from Mr. Simpson. "I think the clockmakers' union is perfectly justified in calling this strike," said he, "and I want to compliment them on the stand they have taken. If organized labor wish to have their demands for a fair wage in any way considered by the company it is up to them to start now. The operators have shown that they are not afraid to stand up for their rights and it is every labor member's duty to support them."

As a delegate of the Trades and Labor Council an empowered to tell you that we are behind you first, last and always, both morally and financially, and I wish you every success in your efforts to better your conditions.

The police department also came in for a hot roast from the orator. What right had they to interfere in the matter he asked. If the police were in the pay of the capitalists of the country it was high time that the workers elected men to public office who would not be dictated to by the T. Eaton Co. and others. The Trades and Labor Council had written a letter to the chief of police demanding an explanation of the conduct of the police in effecting the employees from the T. Eaton Co.'s factory by order of Mr. Eaton, and if a favorable reply was not received by them Mr. Simpson assured his hearers that the matter would be taken before higher authorities and the question of the power of the police in such matters thrashed out. Several organizers of the union also spoke.

Ordered Rise in Prices of Beef

State Contends Telegrams Show Prices Were Fixed in Chicago.

CHICAGO, Feb. 16.—(Can. Press).—Seven hundred and twenty-five telegrams sent by T. G. manager of Armour & Co.'s beef department, and his assistants in July and August, 1910, to eastern representatives, urging them to obtain higher prices for dressed meat, were introduced in evidence by the government in the "pocket trial" today. The messages, which were sent over Armour & Co.'s private wires, were identified by H. A. Russell, beef man in charge of the company, who was on the witness stand all day.

S. Co. on four indictments returned by the federal grand jury investigating the alleged violation of the Sherman Anti-Trust law in connection with the control of wharf facilities at Skagway.

It is charged that the North Pacific Wharves and Trading Company, the Pacific and Arctic Railway and Navigation Company, the Pacific Coast Coal Company and the Canadian Pacific Railway Company formed a combination to monopolize the transportation facilities at Skagway.
