DOWNWARD SLANT ON CORN MARKET

Peace Gossip, Assisted by Moderating Weather, Affects Chicago Pit.

Chicago, Feb. 1.—Peace gossip, together with moderating weather, had the effect of a downward slant. Prices closed easy at the same as yesterday's finish to 5c lower at 11:55 a.m., March, and 21/4c to 2 1/2c lower at 1:45 p.m. net. Provisions gained 2 1/2c to 3c.

Right from the outset the corn market was largely dominated by peace talk, and especially by London news that Austria had made repeated advances to President Wilson. Many traders continued to hold their positions, but the international outlook for 1918, sharp attention was given, owing to all news touching disturbances in Germany. At present to rally the market proved to be of little use, owing to a good deal of the fact that rising temperatures prevailed throughout the corn belt, and that no return to abnormal low levels was now in sight.

Liberal country offerings had much to do with the moderating weather. Besides export demand was lacking both in the east and the Gulf.
