JIM HILL'S CONTROL

Said to Have Added to His Crow's Nest Holdings.

R. M. Young, assistant secretary of the Crow's Nest Pass Coal Co., discards a Vancouver report that J. J. Hill has secured a controlling interest in the company.

The report says that Hill's increased holdings in stock were secured from Toronto shareholders at a cost of nearly two million dollars.

Hill's first move, according to the report here, has been to disperse with the services of Manager G. G. S. Lindsey, the reason assigned being that Lindsey was unfriendly to organized labor.

J. J. Hill has been known for years to have been heavily interested in the company, and rumors of his having secured control have been periodically circulated.

While it has been understood that Mr. Hill did not actually own over half of the stock in the Crow's Nest Pass Coal Company, it has been generally accepted as a fact that he virtually controlled the company's policy.

There have been practically no sales on the Stock Exchange for the past two years.
