BOMB EXPLODED AT A BALL

Another Sensational Incident Has
Occurred at Havana.

Two Men Were Wounded and a Panic Was
Created. The Magazine of the Maine
Which Was Supposed to Have Exploded
Is Found to Be Intact—Spain Blames
the Cause of Accident or Fanaticism.

Havana, Feb. 21.—At about midnight last
night, while a masquerade ball was in
progress at the Infanta Theatre, a bomb
exploded on the second floor, destroying
window blinds and the roof and wounding
a lawyer, named Pan, and his father, and
slightly injuring two other persons. The
explosion caused great confusion, and many
of the masqueraders abandoned the theatre.
Others, however, continued dancing.

SPAIN WOULD BE DEAMELESS

In Case the Disaster Was Accidental or Due
to a Fanatic's Work.

Chicago, Feb. 21.—Robert T. Lincoln,
Secretary of War under President Gar-
field and Arthur, and former Minister to
Spain, is positive that in case of acci-
dent, or if the mine was exploded by a
Spanish fanatic, Spain would not be
burdened with any legal responsibility.
Mr. Lincoln said in another case would
the slightest liability attach to Spain, ac-
cording to a mine exploded by a fanatic or by
accident, that would be the end of the
affair. Giving a mine exploded by the widest
latitude, and stretching precedents to their
limit, there would be no liability against
the Government of Spain.

NO MORE EATON CASES.

The Insurance Companies settle for the
loss on the Eaton Com-
pany's Building.

The suits of W. A. Thompson of the
John Eaton Company against the Sun,
Caledonia and Queen Insurance companies
were entered for trial at Osgoode Hall yes-
terday. It was announced that settlements
in each case had been effected. The sums
paid for are amounts of insurance upon
the burned Eaton building. The total
amount of insurance on the building was
\$22,000, of which \$2000 was in the Queen's
and \$3000 each in the Sun and Caledonia
companies, and \$14,000 in different Ameri-
can companies. The money thus received
must, according to the terms of the lease,
be used in rebuilding.
