ROUGH TIME ON LAKE HURON.

Three Barges Adrift at the Mercy of the Gale—Man Swept Overboard and Drowned.

Sarnia, Ont., Nov. 11.—The steamer Curlew arrived at Port Huron yesterday during the great storm and reported losing her tow line. The tow comprised the barges Fast-set, Reed and Holland. The former anchored and her crew were taken off by the lifeboats from Sand Beach. The last seen of the Reed and Holland was that they were being blown about by the wind. When the schooner Curlew left last night it was reported that a barge had anchored off the lightship, but it was impossible to tell whether it was one of the Curlew's tow or not. The schooner Holland was brought into port about 10 o'clock this morning by one of the river tug which had been on the outlook for the vessels that were adrift. She was waterlogged and gave every appearance of having had a rough time of it on the lake.
