### LORD MINIO AT VANCOUVER

A Military, Naval and Civic Reception Was Tendered the Vice-Regal Party.

### FISHERMEN'S STRIKE IS OVER.

Men Have Practically Accepted the Terms of the Canners' Millitary Withdrawal.

Vancouver, B.C., July 30.—The Excelsior Lord and Lady Minio arrived by the Imperial Limited today. They were received at the depot by Mayor Gordon and the aldermen. Captain Walker of the M.R. Waples, and Admiral Beaumont's private secretary, Mr. Share of the House of Commons, who had been on duty at St. John's during the fishermen's strike, returned a quarter of an hour before the Governor-General's train arrived, and with the Vancouver Veterans' corps, formed a guard of honor to receive His Excellency. The men were in their field uniforms and wearing straw sun hats turned up on the left side, similar to colonial regalia. A salute was fired by the warships as the train pulled up at the depot. In the afternoon their Excellencies were driven through the famous Stanley Park and around the city by the Mayor. They then went to the flag ship to-night, and leave for Victoria in the morning.

### Fishermen's Strike Over.

The fishermen's strike is declared over. The canners yesterday offered to pay 10 cents for the season, which was accepted by the men. The Seattle and Chickadee tribes Indians, who had returned home, are again on their way to the fishing grounds. The militia returned home at noon, after nearly a week's encampment at the scene of the strike.
