OPINION IN MONTREAL: Montreal, Dec. 5.—The World secured today the opinion of a representative liquor man, as well as that of a leading champion of prohibition on the vote yesterday in Ontario.

Mr. Lawrence Wilson, President of the Licensed Victuallers' Association of Montreal and Quebec, said: "When the prohibitionists requested a referendum they assured the voters that they could prove that the sentiment of the Province was strongly in their favor. They were given a chance to prove this. The terms of the referendum to the people were not unfair, and they have not received the number of votes they were required to get."
