#### MIDDLESEX ARRESTS, TOO

One County Resident Who Refused to Heed Warnings Is Being Arrested Today.

London medical boards on Thursday London medical boards on Thursday examined the first man apprehended in this district for failing to comply with the terms of the military service act. J. M. Clarke, a farmer residing near Tillsonburg, was apprehended by the civil authorities and handed over to military officers here. The doctors placed him in a category below "A," but in spite of this he was sent to the 1st Depot Battalion, Western Ontario Regiment. Regiment.

Under existing regulations, as he is below category "A," he can be kept with the unit as long as the officer commanding sees fit. At the end of that time he can be given a week's leave, and after reporting when it has expired be given indefinite leave and kept under surveillance by the military authorities.

Steps are being taken to apprehend certain young men in Middlesex Coun-ey, who have disregarded the require-ments of the militay sevice act to the extent of failing to claim exemption or to report for sevice.

High Constable Watterworth has been instructed to arrest one young man today who has persisted in paying no attention to warnings sent to him, hat he conform to the requirements of the act.

Soldiers Have to Appear Before Armories Board to Secure Them.

INSTRUCTIONS ARE ISSUED

Full Regulations Announced of Procedure to Gain These Coveted Awards.

The following circular letter was received from Ottawa by Major Irvine. officer in charge of mobilization in Military District No. 1, relative to the war service badges that are to be given to those men in Category D, who applied for enlistment on or before August 10, this year. August 10, this year.

By order-in-council on the 10th day of August, certain war service badges are classified and instructions for applicants and medical boards are as follows:

(A) Class D badges are to be granted to those who prior to the 10th August, 1917, have offered themselve for active service in the C. E. F., bu

August, 1917. have offered temasters for active service in the C. E. F., but who have been rejected as, and who still are, medically unfit.

(B) To soldiers who have been discharged under K. R. and O., and who are ineligible for Classes A. B and C. No soldiers who have been so discharged are ineligible for A. B or C badges unless their incapacity can be clearly attributed to military service. No badges shall be issued to any per son who has been rejected on account of temporary disability or who is obviously unfit for service in the C. E. F. Applicants will appear before the medical boards, the time and place of whose sitting being obtained through
