Just outside in the hall is a roomy clothes closet, where the small garments of the children will be hung each day as they enter the nursery. For, to insure cleanliness and uniformity in dress, each little guest will be bathed and put into nursery clothing each put into nursery clothing each

One of the upstairs cupboards discloses shelves of fascinating little garments—small blue and white checked gingham rompers for the children from two to four years; grey gingham dresses for the girls from four to six, and little suits with knee trousers for the older boys. The tiny babies' dresses are of white flannelette, and there are quantities of underclothes.

Rules of Nursery.

There are certain rules laid down, governing the admission of children into the nursery. In these, preference is given to widows and unmarried mothers who may bring their children every day in the week if they so desire. The woman whose husband is not able to support his family through illness or disability may leave their children at the nursery three days of the week. The man whose wife is ill is also given the privileges of the day nursery for his children. For the first child a charge of 25 cents a day is made with an extra charge of 10 cents for each additional child. The children entered must be free from infection with body clean and clean clothing. They will be served three times daily with nourishing food, and while in the nursery must be entirely under the supervision of the nursery staff. The day nursery will open at 7:30 in the morning, and admissions will be made until 9 o'clock. The nursery will close at 6 p.m.

Opinions vary as to which is preferable, and good results can certainly be obtained with either. Preserved eggs lose very little pour it over the eggs. 
