SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quar-ter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Ap-plicant must appear in person at the Do-minion Lands Agency or Sub-Agencyt for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency) on certain condi-tions.

tions. Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteador may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain con-ditions. A habitable house is required, except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

Live stock may be substituted for cul-tivation under certain conditions. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter. section alongside his homestead. Price,

Live stock may be substituted for cul-tivation under certain conditions. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Six months' residence in each of three years, after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres' extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his home-stead right may take a purchased home-stead in certain districts. Price, \$2,00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres, and
