

SOLDIERS AT CAMP USE NEW RAPID FIRE GUNS

Latest Weapon is a Practical Rifle Barrel With Quick Firing Mechanism.

FAN KEEPS IT COOL Local Battalions in Training Attended Various Churches on Sunday.

Regimental church parades were held in various parts of the city on Sunday morning.

Reach England Safely. Word has been received from Lieut.-Stacy that the recent drafts of artillery have arrived all well in England.

Three hundred applications for artillery commissions with the new Toronto and Kingston Brigades have been provisionally granted and about one-third will receive early appointments to various batteries.

Fifteen Hundred Torontonians. Fifteen hundred Toronto men have joined the artillery brigade of the Kingston division.

DECLARATION OF WAR BY PERSIAN GOVERNOR. Hostilities Opened by Him Against Britain and Russia, Says Turkey.

LONDON, Jan. 17.—A despatch to Reuters Telegram Co. from Amsterdam, gives a Constantinople despatch received there, which says: "According to reliable news from Persia, the governor-general of Luristan, Saman-Ed-Sultaneh, has taken over the command of the national forces fighting against the British and Russians, declared war on Great Britain and Russia, and opened hostilities."

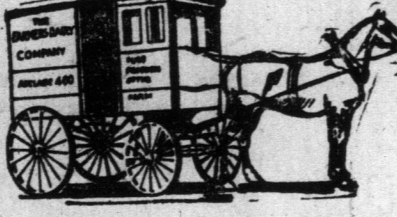

HOW TO MAKE THE SOX FOR THE WORLD'S DAY

Read the Instructions Given in the Article Which is Printed Today.

DO NOT SEND IN MONEY

If You Can't Knit, Buy a Pair of Sox or Some Wool.

Many enquiries have been received during the last few days at the "Sox Day" department of The World regarding the correct and most simplified instructions for knitting.

For the convenience of those who are not able to read The World, the following instructions and useful particulars, copied from the official booklet on "War Work," issued by the National Relief Committee, are given:

"Any sock" should measure as follows: Length from top of sock to bottom of heel, 14 1/2 inches. Length of foot, 11 1/2 inches. Length of ribbing, 4 1/2 inches. Length of leg to commencement of heel, 12 inches.

Six to seven ounces of three-ply wheeling or four-ply fingering, 36 or 37 strands, four steel knitting needles, No. 13, are the materials required to make the largest-sized sock, full instructions for which are given herewith:

Cast on 68 stitches; rib 4 1/2 inches (2 plain, 2 puri, knit plain 7 1/2 inches (12 inches in all).

Heel.—Knit plain 34 stitches on to one needle; turn, puri back these 34 stitches; turn, knit plain; repeat these two rows (always slipping the first stitch) sixteen times (17 in all).

With the inside of the heel towards you, puri 18 stitches, puri 2 together, puri 1.

Knit 6 stitches, slip 1, knit 1, puri slipped stitch over, knit 1, turn, puri 11 stitches, puri 2 together, puri 1.

Knit 12 stitches, slip 1, knit 1, puri slipped stitch over, knit 1, turn, puri 13 stitches, puri 2 together, puri 1.

Knit 14 stitches, slip 1, knit 1, puri slipped stitch over, knit 1, turn, puri 15 stitches, puri 2 together, puri 1.

Knit 16 stitches, slip 1, knit 1, puri slipped stitch over, knit 1, turn, puri 17 stitches, puri 2 together, puri 1.

Knit 18 stitches, slip 1, knit 1, puri slipped stitch over, knit 1, turn, puri 19 stitches, puri 2 together, puri 1.

Pick up and knit 18 stitches down the side of the heel piece.

Knit the 84 stitches of the front needles (on to one needle). Pick up and knit the 18 stitches at the other side of the heel piece.

First needle, knit to within 3 stitches of the front end of side needle, knit 2 together, knit 1.
