The percentage of the loss for the past month, while not sensational, is nevertheless sufficient to indicate clearly the trend. In various lines of business some commercial troubles are developing and in all likelihood the immediate future will disclose an increase in the number of commercial failures and perhaps in the amount of liabilities. Action of American Woollen in the stock market bas been in line with the changed conditions as noted and if the depression should extend it will undoubtedly uncover other weak spots. Furthermore, the sharp advance in call rates yesterday afternoon had a sort of a chilling effect on market enthusiasts, and we have had since then a more general disposition to accept profits and to reduce long lines. This has resulted in some recessions, especially in the industrial list. In rails, today we have had activity in a few issues, but the market could hardly be called a broad one. Technically a change has occurred. The short interest has been no doubt reduced and long lines increased which should result in some irregularity, and possibly further recessions unless the money market should prove easier this coming week.
