

THE PROGRESS THROUGH THE TARIFF BILL

Only One Amendment for Protection of Egyptian Cotton

Washington, Feb. 10.—The Foreign emergency tariff bill got another breath of air in the senate today after having been shoved forward and pulled backward almost daily for a week without having been the subject of debate.

The only actual progress today was in the adoption of a senate finance committee amendment to extend protection to long staple or Egyptian cotton of one and one-eighth inches in length instead of a minimum of one and three-eighths.

Provisions in the wool schedule as the bill passed the house drew no fire, but when the committee amendments on sugar were reached progress was delayed.
