FRENCH SEAMAN HERO OF DARING EXPLOITS

Captain of Destroyer Carried Craft Inshore, Checking German Onslaught

LONDON, Nov. 7.—One of the most daring exploits of the fight along the Flanders coast is credited to a captain of the French destroyer Aventur-

ier, who carried his craft close in shore within actual rain of the shells falling all around. He got within close range of the German batteries and in a few minutes created as much havoc as the vessels further out to sea had been able to work in several days. His action completely checked a terrific assault on the Belgians. He has been recommended for the legion of honor.

FIFTY-ONE OUT OF CLASS OF FIFTY-FIVE ENLIST

JAP FLEET WILL NOW HUNT GERMAN CRUISERS

WASHINGTON, Nov. 7.—Official despatches telling of the fall of Tsingtau were received today at the Japanese Embassy and interpreted as signaling the beginning of an offensive naval

campaign in the Pacific. Three squadrons of warships which have been occupied in blockading Kiaochow will now be released, it is said, to hunt down the German ships in the Pacific.

It was stated at the embassy that in all probability a joint occupation of British and Japanese forces would take place at Tsingtau immediately.
