

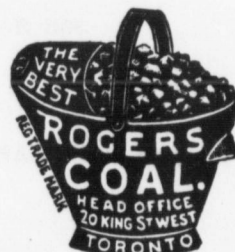

Game Laws of Ontario.

CLOSE SEASON FOR GAME.

The close season for Deer, Elk, Moose, Reindeer and Caribou is from 15th Nov. to 1st Nov. of the following year, but no Moose, Elk, Reindeer or Caribou must be hunted or killed before 25th October, 1900. No dogum ust be allowed to run Deer in the close season. No person must kill more

than two Deer, Elk, Moose, Reindeer or Caribou in the season. Hunting or killing deer by what is known as "crusting," or while they are "yarding," is forbidden. No common carrier or other person shall transport or have in possession for that purpose, any wild deer or raw skin thereof, or any venison, save only from 1st Nov. to 22nd Nov., in each year, unless accompanied by an affidavit that same was taken during the hunting season.

The close season for Grouse, Pheasants, Prairie Fowl, Partridge, Woodcock, Snipe, Rail, Plover or other waterfowl or game bird or animal, including black or grey Squirrels and Hares, is from the 15th Dec. to 15th Sept. in the following year. For Quail and Wild Turkeys, from 15th Dec. to 15th Oct. of the following year, but no Wild Turkeys must be killed before 15th Oct., 1897, and no Prairie Fowl or English or Mongolian Pheasants before 15th Sept., 1897.

The close season for Swans and Geese is from 1st May to 15th Sept., and for Ducks of all kinds from 15th Dec. to 1st Sept. following.

No wild fowl must be taken between half an hour after sunset and half an hour before sunrise, nor on the Lord's Day.

No Beaver or Otter shall be hunted, taken, killed, or had in possession between 1st April and 1st Nov., nor trap set for them during that period, and no Muskrat between 1st May and 1st Jan. But no Beaver or Otter shall be hunted, taken or killed before 1st Nov., 1897.

No person except residents of Ontario and Quebec shall be entitled to hunt without first procuring a license from the Provincial Secretary, the cost of which is \$25.

The Game Laws do not apply to Indians nor to settlers in unorganized districts who kill game for food.

No game birds or animals shall be exported from Ontario, except under special conditions.

Dominion Fishery Laws.

Net fishing of any kind is prohibited in public waters, except under Leases or Licenses. The size of nets is regulated so as to prevent the killing of young fish. Nets cannot be set or seines used so as to bar channels or bays. A general weekly close-time is provided in addition to special close seasons. The use of Explosives or Poisonous substances for catching or killing fish is illegal. The use of firearms for killing fish is prohibited. Mill-dams must be provided with efficient fish passes.
