**Russians Break Through Von Hindenburg's Line****Britain at War With Bulgaria—Khaki Position in West Improved—Civilians Take up Recruiting Work in England**

London, October 15.—Along the western front there has been heavy fighting in the Artois, Champagne and Vosges regions. An official despatch from Sir John French late this evening flatly denying the German official statement of the afternoon in which it was claimed that the British had penetrated the German line at one point for the width of a whole battalion. Such an admission is taken to indicate a serious reverse for Von Hindenburg's forces.

In the east the Russians have turned to the offensive in the region of Drinsk, where the chief Teutonic effort is centered, and although the Germans claim that they have repulsed most of the Russian attacks they admit that the Russians penetrated their line at one point for the width of a whole battalion. Such an admission is taken to indicate a serious reverse for Von Hindenburg's forces.

London, Oct. 15.—A British official report, received under date of 9:45 o'clock tonight from Field Marshal Sir John French, commander-in-chief of the British army in the field, says with reference to the German official statement of today: "The only change in the situation south of La Bassée canal is that we have further improved our positions in the Hohenzollern redoubt. We hold all the ground gained on the 13th."

The British foreign office announces that in view of the fact that Bulgaria has announced she is at war with Serbia, and is an ally of the Central Powers, His Majesty's government has informed the Bulgarian government, through the Swedish minister at London, who is in charge of Bulgarian interests, that a state of war exists between Great Britain and Bulgaria, as from 10 p.m.

London, 15.—British submarines have now cleared the Baltic Sea and the Gulf of Bothnia entirely of German merchant ships, says a despatch to the Star from Copenhagen.

Despatches to the Copenhagen evening newspapers say that a second German torpedo boat was sunk by the British submarine E-19 near Riga.

That twenty-four German travelers have been captured and taken into Grimby since September 15, is disclosed in an official statement printed in the London Gazette tonight.

Paris, Oct. 15.—Losses of the Austro-German forces on the northern front in Serbia have totalled 20,000 killed and 40,000 wounded, according to the latest reports received at Serbian headquarters in Nish, says a despatch from Nish to the Temps.

London, Oct. 15.—Recruiting is to be taken entirely out of the hands of the military authorities, and entrusted exclusively to civilian organizations. This, in a nutshell, is the scheme by which the War Office, director of recruiting for the army, hopes to secure a sufficient number of voluntary enlistments to render recourse to conscription unnecessary. He described the new system at a private conference with the parliamentary recruiting committee and the Joint Labor Recruiting Board this afternoon.

**JUSTIFIABLE HOMICIDE**  
Girl Shot Father While He Was Choking Mother

New York, Oct. 15.—Eva Tiller, a 15-year old girl, who shot and killed her father while he was choking her mother, was freed after an inquest by Coroner J. Russell Fowhey at Ontario-on-Hudson. The coroner decided that the shooting was "justifiable homicide" and directed that the girl be released from custody and turned over to her mother.

The mother said the father was attacking her when the daughter came upon the scene. The girl said that when she heard her parents quarrelling, she found a revolver in a dresser drawer, picked it up and pointed it at her father, but did not expect it to go off.
