EXPLOSIVES FIRED In Rough Trip Across Ocean AT NEW ABERDEEN

Success of Terrorism Effort Would Have Cost Lives

STICKS OF EXPLOSIVE SCATTERED ABOUT

Locks Broken and Holes Are Burned in Floor to Set Off Monobel

SYDNEY, N. S., May 2—A daring attempt to blow up, Saturday night, or early Sunday morning, two large powder mag-azines at No. 2 Colliery, the property of the British Empire Steel Corporation, situated at Citizens Then Adjourn to New Aberdeen, was reported

from Glace Bay today. Watchmen at the mine discovered that the buildings, one

Alex. S. MacNeil, general superintendent of mines, stated tonight that he believed the affair to be the work of persons well acquainted with the explosive properties of monobel (pit powder) and gelatine. He based his opinion on the fact that monobel will burn without exploding and needs a shock to detonate it. The parties responsible were probably aware of this, he said, and consequently endeavored to explode the detonators in the other magazine 50 feet away, in their hope that the resultant shock would set off the explosives.

Both buildings, which are built of brick, had double locks, which were broken, and in the powder magazine some five cases of monobel had been opened and the contents scattered about the floor. Some sticks were burned. In the cap magazine I,600 caps were scattered about the floor. The greatest damage would probably have resulted from the explosion of these, as a single cap is capable of raising a weight of from 800 to 1,000 pounds, and there were over 100,000 caps in the building, Mr. MacNeil stated.

BUILDINGS HOUSING Several Hurt

ST. PIERRE, Miq., May 2—The storm-battered French steamer Mulhouse, disabled during a tempestuous 29-day voyage from Milo, France, was anchored in St. Pierre harbor today.

The Mulhouse wallowed in heavy seas for 12 days before the steamer Pro Patria, answering her call for help, came to her aid and towed her into port. She carried 75 passengers and a crew of 24. Several sailors were injured in the rough passage.


