Sweden Who Was in German Army There Says the Ex-Carinia is With Her.

London, Sept. 3.-The following message from Stockholm signed "Hanson," and in French, has been received by the Daily News:

"I report under reserve a story published by the Svenska Dagbladet on the authority of a certain Erbs, conductor of a Swedish band, who has arrived in Stockholm on leave. Erbs states that the ex-Carinia, with the ex-Carinia and her daughters, has been living in perfect safety in the Crimea since May, that they have never been in Siberia, and that all official reports to the contrary have been manufactured for political purposes.

"As for the ex-Carinia, Erbs knows nothing definite, but mentions a rumor that he is alive and lives in security in a German town. The ex-Carinia would not be disposed to go to Germany, but has sent her jewels there."
