

Seventeen Canadian soldiers, invalided home but in good enough health to take care of themselves, arrived at an Atlantic port recently. Included in the party were ten Canadian nurses.

Won Victoria Cross.

Private J. P. Robertson of Picton, N. S., a member of a battalion which was brigaded with the 20th battalion, is one of the few Canadians to win the Victoria Cross. The official announcement of the award in part is as follows: "For most conspicuous bravery and outstanding devotion to duty in attack. When his platoon was held up by enemy wire and a machine gun causing many casualties, Private Robertson dashed to the opening of the flank, rushed the machine gun, and after a desperate struggle with the crew, killed four and then turned the gun on the remainder. Private Robertson was killed as he was returning with a second soldier who was wounded."
