A writer in the Toronto News reviews the situation as follows:--"It is not surprising that General Botha has resigned the premiership of South Africa. He had to reconcile the people of two nations but recently at war. The con-quered party formed the electral ma-jority. A balance had to be kept between the two factions, and at the same time racial feelings had to be eliminated. The language question was, and is, more acute in South Africa than it is in Canada. 




