Moved by Bro. E. J. Reynolds, seconded by Bro. J. L. Jenkins, "That the Supreme Executive, if they deem advisable, instruct the Society's Solicitor to have all necessary papers prepared to submit to the next Supreme Grand Lodge *re* Dominion Incorporation." Carried.

There being no further business Past Supreme Grand President, Bro. J. W. Kempling, installed the officers for the ensuing term.

The newly installed officers addressed the members of Supreme Grand Lodge on the various branches of the work and value of the Order.

The Supreme Grand Secretary then called the Roll and the Supreme Grand President formally declared the twenty-third session duly closed, and the Supreme Grand Lodge adjourned to meet again in the City of Ottawa on the second Tuesday in March, 1899, at 2 p.m., except in case of emergency of which, however, Constitutional Notice would be given. The members of Supreme Grand Lodge then joined in singing the National Anthem—
