SPO states SUS has high average intelligence but inadequate personality lacking knowledge of ways of world. App'd gave evidence denying theft of money. In this case there is no evidence that that SUS and civilians were drinking or on intimate terms other than the kindness of civilians allowing him to sleep at their home. He abused Belgian hospitality. SUS is young and did admit two of charges. He had a civilian conviction for theft.

This is not a deserving case and in view of civil conviction and admitted theft in these charges, Rev. Ofcr recommends SUS serve his sentence to date of remission, 4 May 46. There do not appear to be any good features to this case.
