THE Overage Star Factory is now the largest establishment of the kind in the United States. The factory and buildings cover 600,000 sq. ft. of ground, and are lighted by 71 and 100 sky-lights; the buildings contain 600,000 lbs. of machinery, among which are three cast iron rollers, weighing 10,000 lbs. each; eight lifting pumps, capable of discharging 80,000 gallons of starch an hour; five rotary and four pumps, capable of discharging 80,000 gallons of water a minute over one mile in length of water pipe; 200 cast iron pipes, in the manufacture of which, 80,000 gallons, and four pairs of cast iron rollers, weighing 10,000 lbs. each, were used. This establishment gives employment to over 100 men, and consumes annually 175,000 to 200,000 bushels of corn, 800,000 bushels of wheat, and from 200,000 to 300,000 lbs. of lumber in the manufacture of boxes and other purposes, and makes 10,000 pounds of starch a day. The machinery is propelled by four water-wheels combining 50 horse power.
